

Local Study

Concourse for Self-financing Post-secondary Education

It provides information on post-secondary institutions and details of full-time locally-accredited higher diploma, associate degree and undergraduate programmes that are not covered by the JUPAS, including their tuition fees, entry requirements, and accreditation and recognition by relevant professional bodies. It also provides information pertaining to the institutions' estimated numbers of intake places, application and admission arrangements as well as their past admission scores and graduate statistics.



Diploma Yi Jin

It provides an alternative pathway for S6 school leavers as well as adult learners aged 21 or above to obtain a formal qualification to pursue employment and further study.



Electronic Advance Application System for Post-secondary Programmes (E-APP)

It is a one-stop online application system for HKDSE candidates in the current academic year to lodge advance applications for full-time locally-accredited sub-degree and undergraduate programmes that are not covered by the JUPAS via the E-APP before the release of HKDSE results.



Non-means-tested Subsidy Scheme for Self-financing Undergraduate Studies in Hong Kong

It is offered by the Government for eligible students pursuing full-time locally accredited local and non-local self-financing

undergraduate (including top-up degree) programmes in Hong Kong (save for those enrolling in places already supported under the Study Subsidy Scheme for Designated Professions/Sectors) offered by eligible institutions.



Study Subsidy Scheme for Designated Professions/Sectors (SSSDP)

It aims to subsidise students to pursue designated full-time locally accredited self-financing undergraduate programmes (about 3000 students per cohort) and subdegree programmes (about 2000 students per cohort) in selected disciplines.







Vocational and Professional Education and Training

VTC Earn & Learn Scheme

It integrates structured classroom learning with on-the-job training, providing young people with a clear career progression pathway and preparing them to join those trades and industries with great manpower demand.



Ethnic Minority Project (VTC)

It aims to provide students with training on specific trade skills to enhance their employability; to provide students with training on life skills to help them adapt to and integrate into society; and to assist students to obtain recognized qualifications to better equip them for further studies or career advancement.



Teen's Programme (VTC)

It aims to provide 300-hour training course for 14-24 teenagers, neither being employed or studied, to motivate their learning ability.



Employees Retraining Board

The Employees Retraining Board (ERB) is a statutory body established in 1992 under the Employees Retraining Ordinance. The ERB co-ordinates, funds and monitors training courses and services that are market-driven and employment-oriented so as to meet the changing needs of the employment market.



Further Studies in the Mainland / Abroad

Mainland University Study Subsidy Scheme

It aims to support Hong Kong students in pursuing undergraduate studies in the Mainland and ensure that no students will be deprived of post-secondary education opportunity due to a lack of means. It comprises two components: "means-tested subsidy" and "non-means-tested subsidy".



Scheme for Admission of Hong Kong Students to Mainland Higher Education Institutions

Mainland higher education institutions participating in the scheme admit Hong Kong students based on their Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Examination results, thus exempting them from taking the Joint Entrance Examination for Mainland Institutions.



Study Abroad

It provides information on the recognition of HKDSE qualifications by overseas institutions.



University Entrance Committee for Overseas Chinese Students, Taiwan

It provides the easiest way to pursue higher study in Taiwan: One registration – various choice and up to 70 programmes can be applied at the same time. Offer will be given based on the scores and preference of the candidates.



Employment and Training

Government Vacancies



Higher Education Employment Information e-Platform (Labour Department)

This e-platform provides employment support for job seekers with higher education so as to enhance their understanding of the Hong Kong employment market and facilitate them to search and apply for suitable job openings. (Remark: This e-platform will be integrated into the Interactive Employment Service of the Labour Department in the third quarter of 2021.)



Interactive Employment Service (Labour Department)

The website provides job vacancy and employment information, and hosts a number of thematic webpages to provide dedicated employment information for specific clientele. Job seekers can also use the Interactive Employment Service to look for suitable vacancies in the job vacancy database of the Labour Department.



Job Fairs (Labour Department)

The Labour Department organises a variety of activities to promote employment services. Job fairs are held to facilitate job seekers and employers to meet and communicate direct.



Youth Employment Start (Labour Department)

Y.E.S. is set up to provide one-stop career guidance service, value-added training and self-employment support service exclusively for young people aged between 15 and 29 who legally work and reside in Hong Kong.



Youth Employment and Training Programme (YETP)(Labour Department)

YETP provides a comprehensive platform of job search with one-stop and diversified pre-employment and on-the-job training for young school leavers aged 15 to 24 with educational attainment at sub-degree level or below
